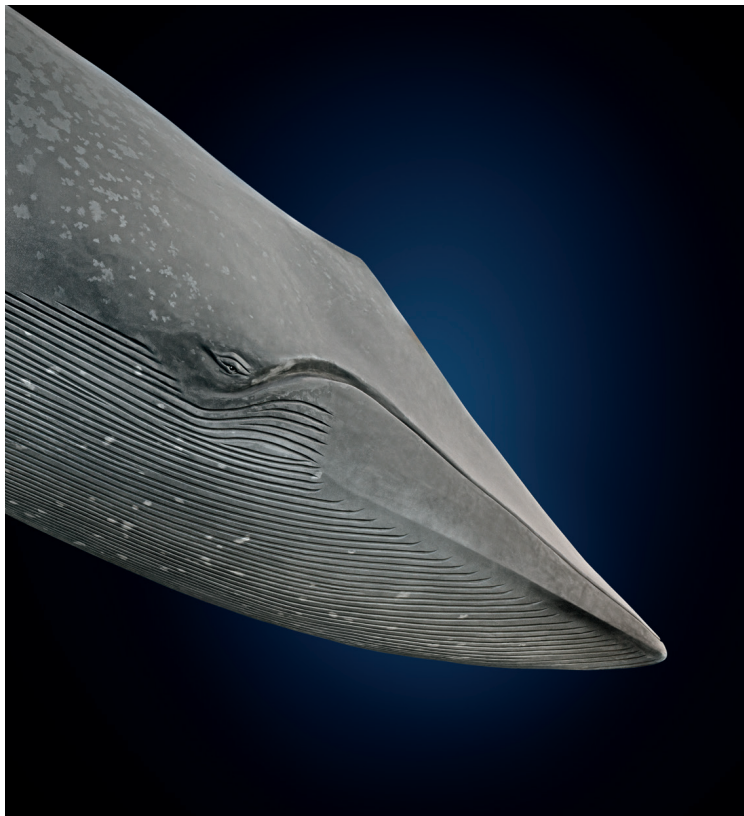

# Second Floor

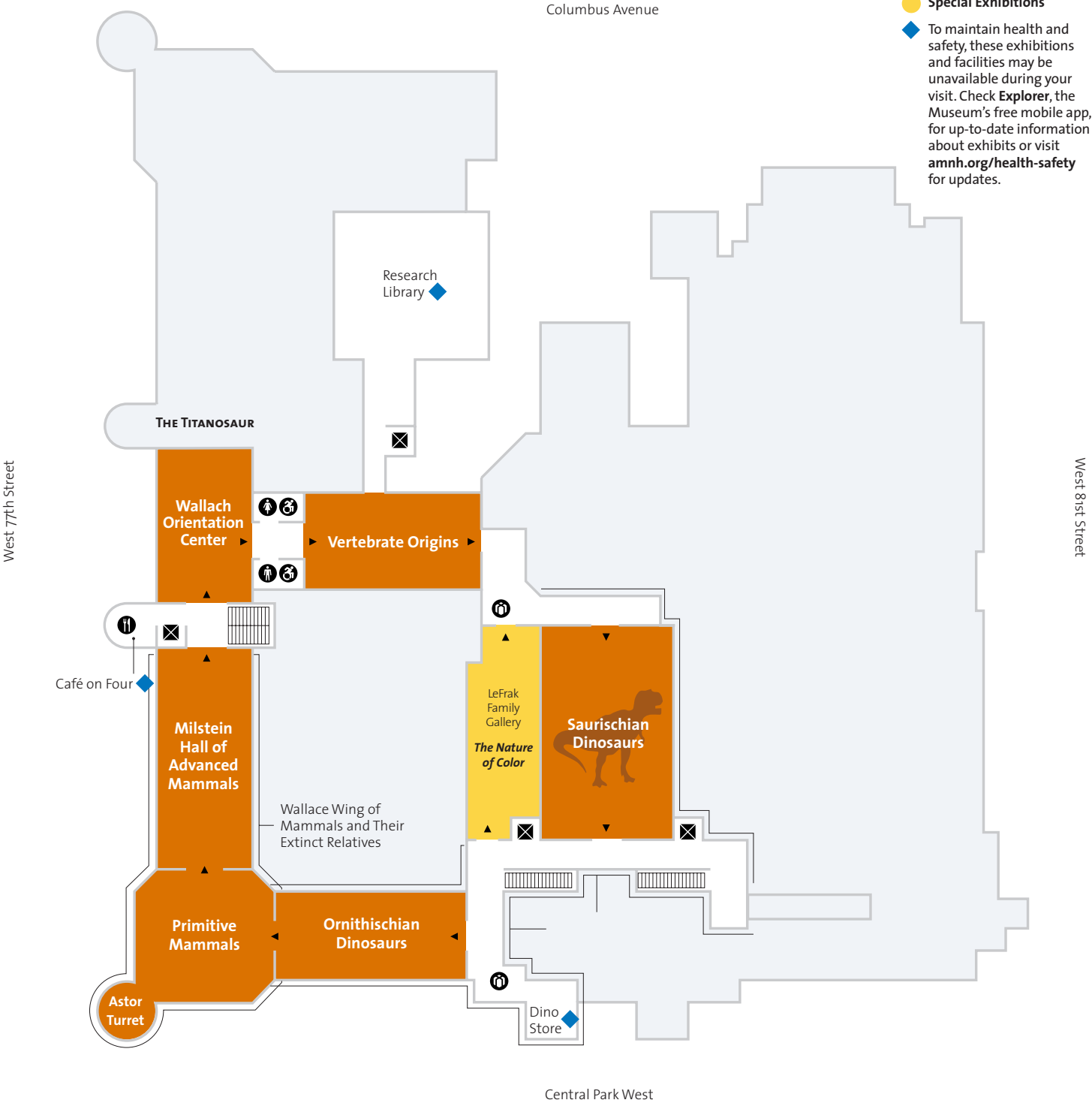
